"The Ransom of Red Chief" – Ransom Letter Assignment Handout

Remember, this letter is supposed to be <u>humorous</u>. You are writing with the goal to make your audience laugh. You are <u>pretending</u> to kidnap an item from someone. DO NOT actually take this item—I will not defend you if you get in trouble!

These are the requirements for producing a quality ransom letter. The letter/poem must:
begin with a greeting to your "victim" ("My Dearest Dora")
be written in poem form with every two lines having the same rhyme scheme
have between 10-20 lines total (Yes, it can have more!)
include the reason you chose the person to be your "victim"
explain what object you are holding for ransom
explain how you know the object is important
clearly state your demands—what conditions must be met
must explain what will happen if your demands are not met—what you will do with the item if the person does not comply
must be signed with a clever alias (fake name)
be in cut-out letters on the final draft
Final draft should be written into the shape of the kidnapped item (if including art in exercise)
should follow correct spelling, grammar, punctuation, and capitalization
